What is an SRO?

What is a School Resource Officer? In 1997, the New Berlin Police Department and the New Berlin Public School District joined together in a cooperative effort to provide a School Resource Officer (SRO) program for the middle and high schools.

The purpose of the program is to have a police officer available and accessible, daily, in the school buildings.

Who is Eisenhower's SRO? Officer Steve Dodson is Eisenhower's SRO. Officer Dodson joined the New Berlin Police Department in 2004 and brings a variety of police experience to New Berlin Eisenhower. Officer Dodson became Eisenhower's SRO in January of 2011. Officer Dodson has specialized training in many areas including juvenile investigations, juvenile law and drug identification. Officer Dodson additionally serves as a DARE Officer for New Berlin West, Eisenhower and Ronald Reagan Elementary.

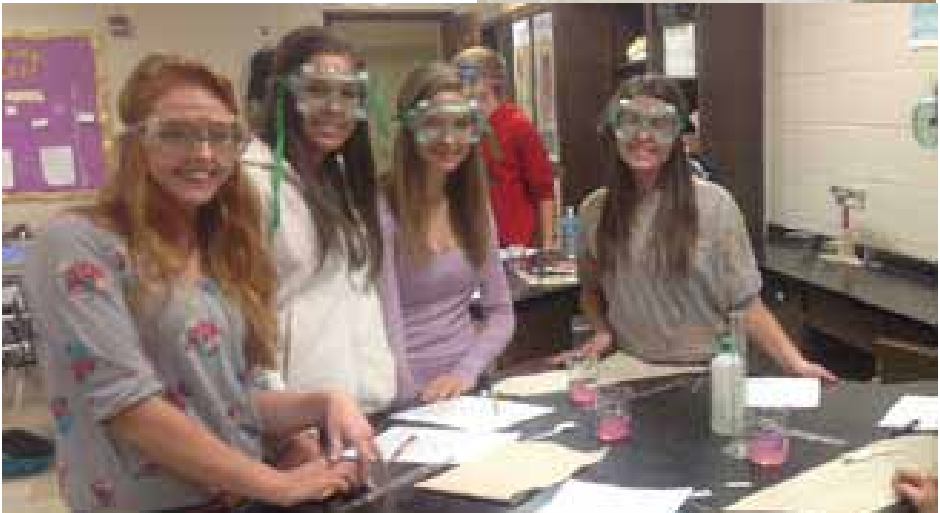
Classroom Highlights

Holzbauer, Honors Biology

In our recent unit, Honors Biology students had the opportunity to explore how cell size affects the growth of cells and the transport of materials within cell. Students had to test this relationship by placing different size cubes of agar (scientific “jello” - a material extracted from sea weed that will solidify when dissolved in water, heated, and cooled). The blocks had an indicator which turned pink as the material moved in, so when they were placed in a solution that diffused into the blocks, they were able to see how far the solution traveled. They measured the distance traveled by the solution into the block. Data collected showed that the larger the cube, which represented a cell, the more difficult it is for material to move through the cell. The material made it closest

to the center in the smallest cube, meaning the smaller the cell, the better the chance it has of moving necessary materials in and out of the cell efficiently.

Bullying Assembly - Classroom Perspective

A rapidly-growing epidemic, bullying, was addressed school-wide earlier this month to promote awareness and prevention among our school community. Information was presented to and discussed among students using various media including YouTube, PowerPoints, skits, and posters. Students were given the number for the anonymous tip line that run through the New Berlin Police Department and can be

directed to our school police liaison, Officer Dodson. At the conclusion of the presentation, all staff and students created a poster to highlight positivity and anti-bullying and were given the opportunity to sign an anti-bullying pledge. Overall, students were engaged and came up with great ways to combat bullying and connect in a positive way.

Classroom Highlights

Kutmas & Kirby, English

The 7th and 8th graders in Mrs. Kutmas's and Ms. Kirby's classes are working hard on developing better sentences in their English classes. Practicing the skill of using compound and complex sentences will go hand in hand with developing their writing this year. Ask your son or daughter if they can write a compound or complex sentence for you to assess their understanding of this skill. Tell them to explain to you what the mnemonic device of FANBOYS and AAAWWUBBIS means! :)

Falk, Spanish II

Saludos from Spanish class! We have an exciting year ahead of us. Right now in Spanish II, we're studying sports vocabulary and various athletes in the Spanish-speaking world. We'll read some articles about how Spanish-speaking countries performed in the Olympics this summer. In Spanish IV, we are learning about ourselves as individuals as we study Gardner's theory of Multiple Intelligences and apply it to how we each learn. Students will be able to describe themselves in depth

and talk about their future plans. In AP Spanish, we're studying the people, traditions, and culture of Guatemala. Students will hear 6 guest speakers talk about their experiences in Guatemala. They will also do a research project and "interview" some Guatemalan women, design their own huipil, and write a grant proposal for a proposed service project.

To conclude the unit, students will present their project at a Service Project fair, and we'll vote on who designed the best project.

Maynard, Digital Concepts

In Digital Concepts, we are currently working with Audacity, a free sound editor. We are working with individual sounds to create a larger scene. When we're done, the listener should be able to tell where we are. Many students are using Halloween as a theme for spooky projects, and others are taking us to places like farms, the ocean, and even the forest at night. Upcoming projects will use recorded voices, music, and effects to tell a story. Overall, it's a fun time in Digital Concepts!

Schroeder, Spanish III

Saludos Padres de Familia! In our Spanish 3 classes the students have been studying the preterite tense combined with travel and art vocabulary. This week they have done mini Show-and-Tell presentations, in Spanish of course, about a trip they have taken, bringing in a souvenir to show the class. I have enjoyed learning about their trips!

If you hear the melody of children's songs from the Mandarin classroom, don't be surprised - the students are quickly picking up a new language through songs! Impressively, the classes are also working hard on writing Chinese characters. 



Fox River Field Trip

On October 24th, students in AP Environmental Science and AP Biology took a fieldtrip to the EB Shurts Center in Waukesha, WI. Here students and parent volunteers took part in chemical, physical and biological testing of the Fox River to determine the fitness of the river and the level of pollutants in the river. Students were in the river digging up benthic macro-invertebrates and classifying them according to their ability to survive in polluted waters, so as to act as biological indicators of pollution. They also used field chemical kits and HACH™ spectrometers to perform nitrate and phosphate tests. Students additionally tested turbidity, pH, and water temperature. We could not have asked for a better day to complete this hands-on laboratory. Even though the water was a chilly 14° C the sun was out and we enjoyed one of the last + 24° C days of the year learning about water systems and analytical sampling techniques. When all was said and done, students used all the evidence gathered and determined that the river was overall healthy and..... no one fell in this year!!! A special thank you goes out to the parent volunteers and the EB Shurts faculty members for all their efforts in helping this to be a great real-world, hands-on, learning experience for the students!!
