In August, you were given the opportunity to choose whether you wanted your child(ren) to receive their education in-person or virtually. We know that this may have been a difficult choice for you and your families to make, but based on our parent survey data, 93 percent of families feel they made the right choice for their child(ren)'s education. We are proud of our School District of New Berlin staff, students and parents/guardians for making our fall instruction as rigorous and engaging as possible.

We will continue to offer both in-person and virtual learning models through the second semester, which begins Jan. 28. The pandemic has not improved since your original choice was made, so we will assume that your child will be continuing with the same instructional model for the second semester unless you notify your school's administrative assistant at the email addresses below by Dec.17.

Please note that at the elementary level, a change in your child's educational model for second semester will likely result in your child having a new teacher. Additionally, other families' choices may result in class make-up and staffing changes as well, as we may be required to shift teacher resources from virtual to in-person, or vice versa. We expect changes to the educational model chosen by parents at the secondary level, however, to have minimal impact on staffing.
