Happy First Week of School Poplar Creek Families!


Students are quickly figuring out the routines and expectations, getting to know new friends and staff members, and jumping right back into learning!

# **Student Drop Off and Pick Up Procedure Reminders**

Thank you everyone for your patience, and for not running over Mr. S., as we all navigate the family drop off and pick up line safely!



 The west entrance is for dropping off and picking up students. You must enter the parking lot from Cleveland Ave with a

- right turn and exit with a right turn. The east entrance is for busses only.
- Please form two lines of cars throughout the parking area (there is a yellow dotted line to assist drivers) Merge into one single car line when entering the lower playground
- Please pull all the way around and past the cafeteria doors when it is your turn so that more vehicles can pull up behind you.
- For pick-up, please have your car tag with student name and number visible in the driver's side window when our staff member is taking names and move it to the passenger's side window when getting close to the cafeteria doors. If you are the first few in line you can just put it in the passenger's side window.
- There will be staff members on duty from 8:35-8:50 am at the student drop-off site. For safety, children should remain inside the vehicle until staff comes on duty at 8:35 am. At 8:35 am, staff members will help open doors to vehicles when needed. Parents should not get out of their vehicles to say goodbye. This holds up the line. If you need extra time to help your child in or out of the car, please pull into the center of the lower parking lot.

- Doors close promptly at 8:50 am. After this time your child is tardy, and you must sign them in at the office.
- Parents should stay in their cars ready to go at dismissal time. Staff members will come outside at 3:50 pm to help students get into their cars if necessary.
- In the morning, 10-12 vehicles can unload at one time as students can enter the building through the gym or cafeteria doors.
- In the afternoon, 4-6 vehicles can load at one time as students will only exit the building from the cafeteria doors

All students receive a free t-shirt! Students will get sponsors to donate money and win cool prizes!


On the night of the Creek Crawl students will walk the path through the nature center attached to our playground!

## **Parent University**

Dear New Berlin Families,

Many of you now have a year of experience with the school district's new approach to teaching reading. Maybe you have heard about the new state legislation called Act 20 or have read or heard about "The Science of Reading" or evidence-based literacy instruction in the news or on a podcast. You might be wondering what it is and how you can help your child at home.

This year the School District of New Berlin will host a series of seven Parent University sessions focused on understanding literacy development and how to help children at home. During each session, a presenter will unpack part of early literacy. Parents will get a picture of what this looks like in their child's classroom and leave with activities to help their child at home.

Each elementary school will host an identical session so the event will be close to your home. All of the sessions will start at 6 p.m. and will last for an hour with an additional 30 minutes of question-and-answer time. The dates and topics are listed below.

## **Allergy Awareness**

There are children at our school who have extreme allergies to raw eggs, dairy, peanuts/peanut oil, tree nuts/tree nut oil and sesame/sesame oil. Tree nuts include almonds, Brazil nuts, cashews, hazelnut/filbert, pecan, pine nut, pistachio, walnuts, chestnuts and macadamia nuts. This also includes any food that has been prepared with raw eggs, dairy, peanuts, tree nuts or sesame; peanut, tree nut or sesame oil, or peanut or tree nut flour. The allergies

of these children are so severe that it could be life threatening.

Our staff has been made aware of this situation and has been instructed in the correct emergency procedures. Prevention, of course, is the best approach and therefore we are requesting your cooperation in observing the following guidelines to make our classroom and lunch room safe for this student.

- NO sharing of food in the classroom during snack time or in the lunchroom.
- Please contact your classroom teacher before bringing treats to school for distribution.
- Hand washing before and after eating will be emphasized.
- We kindly request that your child not bring products with nuts or dairy into classrooms if there is a child with severe nut or dairy allergies in their class.
- Individual classroom teachers will be informing families if they have a nut/sesame free or dairy/ egg free classroom.

Peanut/tree nut butter, peanut/tree nut/sesame products and dairy products may be packed in your child's lunch but must be kept outside of the classrooms that have students with these severe allergies.

We appreciate your cooperation as we endeavor to make Poplar Creek Elementary a safe environment for all students!

### **How to report an absence**

If your child will not be in school at the start of the day for any reason, a parent or guardian must notify the main office before the first bell at 8:50 AM. You can do so by calling 262-789-6520 and leaving a message with your child's name and reason for absence. This line is accessible 24 hours a day. You can also email anita.jares@nbexcellence.org.

If you know ahead of time that your child will be absent, please send a note to your child's teacher.
