Principal's Message

Greetings West Families,

This newsletter marks the end of the first semester and onset of the second semester at West. Along with the transition into the second semester, we are engaged in the 2022-2023 course signup period in the school district. With that in



mind, there are a few thoughts to consider as you support your student(s) with the course signup process as they make plans for their future at New Berlin West and beyond.

Your Academic and Career Plan: What are your post-secondary plans and how can you use your school schedule to help you achieve them? What courses will help to support this plan? Do you want to take advantage of dual enrollment options (both high school and postsecondary credit) or Career and Service Based Learning Options? If so, how is your schedule supporting these opportunities as you move through your school career? Rigor of schedule and overall grade point average: As you think about your schedule for next year, please consider that post-secondary institutions criteria for selection includes both appropriate rigor and overall grade point. As you and your student think of these items, especially in the junior and senior years, you need to consider your goals for post-secondary education and how those institutions will view your transcript in these areas. Balance: Consider not only your course schedule and rigor, yet other things as well when you are looking at your schedule options. It is important to have a schedule that allows balance for school activities (we

encourage every student to participate in at least one per year) and/or work schedules and outside responsibilities. These are important

considerations as you think about your options

for the upcoming school year.

As you finalize your schedule selections for the upcoming year, we encourage you to review the recommendations provided by teachers (in the comments on your student's semester report cards!) and discuss this information with your student to ensure you are part of these important decisions. Please do contact us (your student's current teacher and/or school counselor are the best contacts) if you have questions regarding the options presented. Securly Tipline: Important School Safety Tool

The SDNB is proud to partner with Securly to offer Tipline, an anonymous tip-reporting system designed to give students another voice in our "See Something, Say Something" efforts.

All tips, whether submitted via phone, text. All tips, whether submitted via phone, text, online or the app, go to the Securly 24 team, highly trained specialists with backgrounds in psychology, sociology and working / volunteering with children. The Securly 24 team determines the validity and risk level of all tips, and, based on the assessment, time of day, etc., the team determines whom to alert about the tip. "Extreme Risk" alerts, for example, are directed directly to alerts, for example, are directed directly to the New Berlin Police Department via 911; low-risk alerts result in an email to the building administrators.

Parents and students can download the Securly Tipline app in the Apple App Store or in Google Play (app store for Android phones). You can also submit tips on the web at www.securly.com/tip, by phone at 1-833-300STOP or email at tipline@securly.com.



Tipline is another tool offered by Securly to enhance the safety of our students, staff and schools. It works hand-in-hand with Securly's cloud-based content-filtering that helps keep students safe on their school-issued devices.

Have you ever felt extremely uncomfortable in a social situation?

Maybe you began sweating or your heartbeat went up. Many people experience the same thing. To be specific, did you know that around 9.1% of adolescents in the U.S. suffer from social anxiety disorder?

Symptoms for social anxiety include the fear of being judged or humiliated, intense fear of interactions with ptransacts and obscied symptoms such as tonce muscles, pauses, and

interacting with strangers, and physical symptoms such as tense muscles, nausea, and blushing in social settings. Symptoms may change over time based on changes in daily life or

If you experience this or know somebody that does, get help early! Avoiding social situations may help in the short-term, but not in the long-term. Seek a professional for psychotherapy or medication, join a support group, and avoid unhealthy substance abuse.

Information Related to At-Home COVID-19 Tests

COVID-19 symptoms, you may need to get another COVID-19 test from a health care provider or at a community testing site.

At-home COVID-19 tests are not supervised by a health care provider and are not sent to a lab for processing. This is why at-home tests cannot be used to inform any official public health decisions.

- A negative at-home test result will not be accepted as a way to shorten
- A negative at-floring test result will not be referenced to identify a 90-day period of possible immunity which would make you exempt from quarantine if you had close contact with someone with COVID-19.

 At-home tests cannot be used to enter or return to the U.S. when traveling from an international location.

What do my at-home COVID-19 test results mean?

If your test results are positive and reported to public health, you may receive information from a contact tracer about how to monitor your illness and how to prevent spreading COVID-19 to others.
