





Information Related to At-Home COVID-19 Tests

At-home COVID-19 test kits are useful tools to help families determine what steps to take with their child(ren) when he or she is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms or has been in close contact with someone who has recently tested positive.

At-home COVID-19 tests, however, are not supervised by a health care provider and are not sent to a lab for processing. Therefore, at-home results are not accepted by the Waukesha County Public Health Department as valid results that can be used to inform official public health decisions. In the case of the School District of New Berlin, the results cannot be used to determine "return dates" for infected students, cannot be used to shorten suggested quarantine periods and cannot be used to identify 90-day periods of possible immunity.

We encourage those who choose to use at-home tests to report the results - either positive or negative - to their health care provider. They may recommend that you get another test from a healthcare provider or at a community testing site.

COVID-19 symptoms, you may need to get another COVID-19 test from a health care provider or at a community testing site.

At-home COVID-19 tests are not supervised by a health care provider and are not sent to a lab for processing. This is why at-home tests cannot be used to inform any official public health decisions.

- A negative at-home test result will not be accepted as a way to shorten quarantine.
- A positive at-home test result will not be referenced to identify a 90-day period of possible immunity which would make you exempt from quarantine if you had close contact with someone with COVID-19.
- At-home tests cannot be used to enter or return to the U.S. when traveling from an international location.

What do my at-home COVID-19 test results mean?

If your test results are positive and reported to public health, you may receive information from a contact tracer about how to monitor your illness and how to prevent spreading COVID-19 to others.

West Families,

It is important for us to do our part in keeping ourselves and others safe. One way of doing this is reporting when we hear or see something that we know can be harmful to ourselves or others. These reports may vary from drug complaints, threat toward others, or threat of self harm. When making a report, it is important to only report accurate information!

When talking about **reporting information**, **we have more than one option**. One program that has been around for a while is **Crime Stoppers**. Crime Stoppers allows for someone to make a report by text or online. You can remain anonymous while providing information! Also, based on what the information provided leads up to, Crime Stops does officer cash rewards.

Another program is **Speak Up**, **Speak Out**. This program is run by the state of Wisconsin. It is very similar to Crime Stops, where someone is able to report a type by phone (call/text), through an app on the phone, and also online. The information provided is then vetted to determine the level of information and if police involvement is imminent. The information may be directed to the appropriate school to further investigate.

Another option is through **Securly Tipline**, students can submit anonymous tips through an app, text, email or phone message. Students can submit tips for any concerns that they feel need to be shared, including bullying, self-harm, and other forms of violence.




