

The article below is an excerpt of an article that was shared with me last week. I think it highlights things well and gives us all places to focus and have conversations. I recognize that this is likely done on a regular basis yet just wanted to take the opportunity as we close this month to help keep the spotlight on these important conversations. We have a lot to be proud of as a school and want to continue to grow and improve. Thank you for taking a few moments to read this and do what you can to help us continue to work together to help everyone feel an accepted part of our school.

There is little more heartbreaking than seeing your child hurt by an act of bullying at school or in the neighborhood. And, equally concerning is finding out that your child's aggressive behaviors have hurt another child.

Bullying is defined as unwanted, aggressive behavior among school-aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated or has the potential to be repeated over time.

In 2006, PACER, a leading organization bringing awareness to bullying prevention in schools, founded National Bullying Prevention Month. This month is dedicated to preventing the hurtful acts of bullying and promoting kindness, acceptance, and inclusion.

Because National Bullying Prevention Month is 31 days long, we all have plenty of time to have small meaningful conversations with the children in our care. Here are some ideas to help you start the discussion in your families:

Have a conversation about practicing empathy. Encourage the children in your care to reach out to new classmates or struggling classmates. Ask them to notice when someone in their class or circle could use a smile, a kind word, or a kind greeting.

Reward respectful behaviors when we see them in our children. Often, children have a way of showing respect to others that can go unnoticed by adults. Take time this month to intentionally see the good and respectful actions of the children in your care and acknowledge them.

Take time to remind children that each person has a deep value and was created for a purpose - including them! Maybe ask them to name some of the students in their class and tell you what makes that person interesting. End the conversation by sharing what you find interesting about each of your children too!

Make a point to discuss courage and bravery. When

they see someone saying hurtful things to another person, remind the children in your care that they are brave enough to report it to an adult. They can also show bravery and courage by being kind to a child being bullied by asking them to join them in activities or sit with them at lunch.

#### **Senior Parents**

College Applications and Letters of Recommendation FAQ-Letter of recommendation form is available online and in students services, complete this form and give it to recommenders.

The Transcript Release Form is available online and in student services. Students under 18 years of age must have a parent/guardian signature on this form to release their transcript.

Please note that if you apply to a school via the Common Application, please write "Common App" specifically on your transcript release form. That will allow Counselors to upload your transcripts for every Common Application school. If you do NOT apply via the Common Application please list those specific schools on your transcript release form and Ms. Burke will send your transcript.

FAFSA Opened Oct. 1, so get completed as soon as possible! Many scholarships are available at the SDNB Scholarship Website, updates will continue throughout the year. Check back often for new opportunities!

#### **AP Testing**

To: New Berlin West students enrolled in Advanced Placement (AP) courses Re: AP Testing Registration Updates

By now, all students in an AP class should have been instructed by their AP teachers to create a CollegeBoard account or sign in to their existing CollegeBoard account to join their AP Classroom(s) which enables their registration for their AP Exam(s) in May. Once a student has signed in to the CollegeBoard account, students must join each online AP Classroom(s) with codes unique to each individual class to enable the exam registration for each subject. If students have not completed this step, they will not be registered for the exam(s) this coming May. Please keep in mind that the student's username and password are unique to each individual student and New Berlin West does not have access to their individual account login and password information. Please keep these important pieces of information in mind as it relates to your AP courses and AP exams in May.

The fee for each AP exam is \$96.00 and will automatically be added to your fees in Infinite Campus beginning mid October.




# Unity Day

#### Mamma Mia!


West TAP presents ABBA's Mamma Mia! A mother. A daughter. Three possible dads. And a trip down the aisle you'll never forget!



#### Homework Club-


